Dear Chairwoman DeLauro and Ranking Member Cole:

We write in strong support of the Department of Labor YouthBuild program and respectfully request that you provide no less than \$127.5 million for this critical program in the fiscal year 2021 (FY21) Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill.

Our nation's success depends on successfully reconnecting unemployed and undereducated young people. YouthBuild engages disadvantaged, low-income youth in a full-time program emphasizing education and hands-on job training. In addition, the program offers personal counseling, mentoring, leadership development, and service opportunities for participants.

YouthBuild students earn a high school diploma or equivalent; build affordable housing for homeless and low-income people; and train for jobs in growing sectors like healthcare, technology, and customer service. Since federal funding began in fiscal year 1993, more than 180,000 YouthBuild students in 46 states participated in the program, built more than 35,000 units of affordable housing, and performed nearly 50 million hours of community service. By raising a 25 percent non-federal match, local programs leverage private funds to maximize YouthBuild's impact.

The Department of Labor manages this program with a heavy focus on performance, and significant evidence shows that YouthBuild works. A recent study found that, compared with their peers, YouthBuild students earn more GEDs, enroll in college and vocational school in higher numbers, and go on to earn roughly 20 percent higher salaries in their careers.

Continued federal support for this effective, strategic investment would allow the Department of Labor to sustain current grantees and fund new programs to meet demand. Nearly 4.5 million young people, aged 16 to 24, are not in school or employed. Each year, there are more communities applying to host YouthBuild sites and young people aspiring to join the program than the Department can afford to support. The requested funding would ensure that participants receive the support they need to become skilled, educated, and service-oriented workers.

We believe that these strong results merit the continued, robust federal investment in the YouthBuild Program. Last year, the House-passed bill included the requested \$127.5 million, which would have restored funding to the level appropriated in fiscal year 2010. The final, enacted appropriations package provided a smaller funding increase of \$94.5 million. This year, we hope that the Subcommittee will again restore the full \$127.5 million in the FY21 Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill.

As always, we appreciate your consideration of this request and thank you for your continued support of YouthBuild's work and mission.

We write in strong support of the Department of Labor YouthBuild program and respectfully request that you provide ample funding sufficient to meet demand for this critical program in the FY21 Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies appropriations bill. Existing local YouthBuild programs turn away three or four youth for every participant they are able to enroll. In addition, each year, the Department of Labor receives many more applications from communities than it can fund.

Our Nation's ability to reconnect unemployed and undereducated young adults is essential to our economic success. YouthBuild engages disadvantaged, low-income youth in a full-time program that emphasizes education and hands-on job training. The program accompanies these initiatives with personal counseling, mentoring, leadership development, and service opportunities for the participants.

While earning a high school diploma or equivalent, YouthBuild students build affordable housing for homeless and low-income people, and train for jobs in growing sectors like healthcare, technology, and customer service. Local programs are required to raise a 25% non-federal match, which leverages private funds to maximize YouthBuild's impact. Since federal funding began in FY93, more than 180,000 YouthBuild students in 46 states participated in the programs, built more than 39,000 units of affordable housing, and performed nearly 50 million hours of community service.

The Department of Labor manages this program with heavy focus on performance, providing ample evidence that YouthBuild works. A recent rigorous, randomized multiyear study found that, compared with their peers who received alternative services, YouthBuild students earn more GEDs, enroll in college and vocational school in higher numbers, and go on to earn roughly 20 percent higher salaries in their careers.

Additional federal support for this effective, strategic investment is very much needed. An ample FY21 appropriation will allow the Department to provide adequate support for current grantees and fund new programs where the great need is unmet. The requested funding would address the fact that over 4 million unemployed young people,

who are not enrolled in an educational program, need support, training, and resources to thrive and succeed as skilled, educated, and service-oriented members of our Nation's workforce.

These strong results merit increased federal investment in the DOL YouthBuild program to meet demand. As always, we appreciate your consideration and thank you for your previous support of YouthBuild's work and mission.

Dear Chairman Blunt and Ranking Member Murray,

We write to express our strong support for the U.S. Department of Labor's YouthBuild program in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education Appropriations Bill. We appreciate your support for increased funding in the final FY2020 appropriation, and respectfully request that you continue to provide increased funding sufficient to meet demand for this important program. There are three times more applicants than capacity in the program to fulfill these requests, indicating the significant need for additional federal support for this critical program.

Our nation's ability to reconnect unemployed and undereducated young adults is essential to our economic success. YouthBuild focuses on achieving this critical task. Young people between the ages of 16 and 24, who left high school without a diploma, apply and enroll in YouthBuild for an average of 10 months. This evidence-based model includes an equal division between helping participants earn their high school diploma or equivalent and teaching job skills by building affordable housing for homeless and low-income people in their communities. In addition to construction, some young people train for jobs in other growing sectors, such as healthcare, technology, and customer service.

Since YouthBuild began as a federal program in 1992, over 180,000 YouthBuild students in 44 states have built nearly 39,000 units of affordable housing in their communities and performed more than 49.5 million hours of community service. The U.S. Department of Labor manages this program with a heavy focus on data and performance, which has ensured YouthBuild delivers real results for its participants. In fact, a recent multi-year, randomized controlled trial study demonstrated that YouthBuild students achieve 47 percent more GED attainment, 52 percent greater vocational school enrollment, 24 percent more college enrollment, and roughly 20 percent greater earnings, even when compared to highly motivated youth receiving other services.

In America today, there are over 4 million young adults, between the ages of 16 and 24, who are not in school or work. An estimated 2 million of these young people have grown up in poverty and in under-resourced communities of all kinds across urban, rural, and tribal areas of the country.

Given this significant need, demand for YouthBuild greatly exceeds federally funded available placements through the program. Many strong local sponsors in our states apply to launch or continue YouthBuild programs but there is insufficient funding to support these critical local efforts.

We strongly believe that increased funding to meet the demand for YouthBuild is an effective, strategic investment in putting the nation's disconnected youth on a path to success while building an educated, connected, and skilled workforce. For this reason, we request that the Committee provide sufficient funding for the Department of Labor YouthBuild program to meet the continued and growing need for its services.

As always, we appreciate your consideration of our request, and thank you for your previous support of YouthBuild's work and mission.
