In YouthBuild programs around the world, young people who are out of school and out of work reclaim their education, gain job skills and credentials, and become leaders in their communities. These young people are in greatest need of access to the tools to succeed, and they are our greatest source of untapped potential to bolster economic mobility and transform the world. In YouthBuild's environment of love, respect, high expectations, community, and agency, young people overcome barriers and build long-term professional and personal success.

36,000+ units of affordable housing and other community assets built

Domestic Impact

In 2023, YouthBuild served over 5,000 students within the United States.

PARTICIPANTS

- 85% enter without a high school credential
- 89% economically disadvantaged
- 17% court-involved
- 12% parents

OUTCOMES

- 79% obtained a high school diploma or equivalency, or other credentials
- 72% completed the program
- 43% went on to postsecondary education or jobs
- \$16.07 average wage at placement
- 5% recidivism rate for court-involved students within one year of enrollment

International Impact

In 2023, YouthBuild served over 6,000 students outside of the United States.

OUTCOMES

- 83% completed the program
- 60% secured job, internship, apprenticeship, self-employment, or technical training opportunities, or were placed into further education
- 60 community asset building projects completed
